1. **CANCELLED UNTIL 5/23 PER PRIME ENGINEERING- (NANCYNIELSON)**  
Notice of Intent as filed by Tim Kelley for 173 Pope's Island (con't from December 28, 1999 throughout this calendar year at their request). Applicant proposes to repair existing docking facility, resetting damaged piles and exsisting rip-rap. ( Rich Rheume of Prime Engineering to bring in new data along with clear and concise scope of work. New site plans are needed and a new filing with the state for a chapter 91 license.)

2. (Con't from February 22, 2000) Request for Determination of Applicability as filed by TEC Associates for property located at the Conrail CSX-right of way. No work is proposed within wetland resource areas. Vegetation control will conform to the guidelines set forth in the Massachusetts Right-Of-Way Management Regulations (333CMR 11.00) and the preface to the Wetlands Protection Regulations (310 CMR 10.00) relative to rights-of- way management. Representative is Wayne Duffet of TEC Associates.

3. Request for Determination of Applicability as filed by Allen C. Vieira for property located at the south side of Haskell Street, map 123A lots 100,101 & 102. Applicant proposes to construct a single family home with driveway.

4. Request for Determination of Applicability a filed by Scott Alfonse of City of New Bedford for property located on Eliot Street, map 130 lots 452 and 209. Applicant proposes to flush pipe on the west side of BVW using a high pressure water and vacuum system.
